

# Questions for How To Share Christ wk2

- Why is it important to understand the idea of world views?
- If everyone has a worldview, why are we not more aware of our worldview?
- Most people hold an amalgam worldview. Why? What causes this blend of world views?
- According to George Barna, 19% of Christians hold a Biblical Worldview. “For the purposes of the survey, a “biblical worldview” was defined as believing that absolute moral truth exists; the Bible is totally accurate in all of the principles it teaches; Satan is considered to be a real being or force, not merely symbolic; a person cannot earn their way into Heaven by trying to be good or do good works; Jesus Christ lived a sinless life on earth; and God is the all-knowing, all-powerful creator of the world who still rules the universe today. In the research, anyone who held all of those beliefs was said to have a biblical worldview.”
  - By that definition, do you hold a Biblical worldview?
  - Do you think that definition is too strict or not strict enough?
- In the sermon Pastor Keith used a term called “positive deconstruction” which we use to examine world views. Was positive deconstruction explained so that you understood it?
- There are really three questions to ask in positive deconstruction to help analyze the strength of a worldview:
  - Is it coherent? In other words, does it make sense and agree with itself?
  - Does it correspond to reality? In other words, is there evidence in reality for their claim?
  - Does it work?
- Do you have to understand all of these questions and all kinds of world views in order to share Christ with someone?
  - ANSWER: No. You can uncover beliefs of the person you are witnessing to as you go along and study to help you in your efforts.
- Given the complexities of very different and competing world views, is it easier or harder to share your faith?
- If Christ really is the answer for a lost world, do you think Christians are willing to put in the effort it takes to study and answer objections people bring up that have different world views? Why or why not?
  - Are you willing to study and put in the effort it requires to help a friend or family member see the truth?
- What things do you feel you need to be able to share your faith in such a complex world?
- How can the church help you in this?
